## Regina's New Aquatics Centre to use Geothermal Energy

The City of Regina has begun the planning and design phases for its new \$189 million aquatics facility. With a net-zero by 2050 goal, the city plans to use a geothermal energy system – the first of its kind in the province – to heat the facility. This system will pump hot brine water from a source over two kilometres below the surface and provide sustainable energy for up to 70 years.
